



## Alexander Central High School Expectations for Remote Learning

<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>● Be ready to learn at the start time of class (face-to-face and online). Make sure devices are charged.</li><li>● Attend on your assigned face-to-face school days.</li><li>● Be online during scheduled times.</li><li>● Your best behavior is crucial as we have limited time for face-to-face instruction</li><li>● Actively participate in class by sharing work and contributing to discussion in class.</li><li>● Use headphones to minimize distractions.</li><li>● Complete your own work as assigned and submit when due.</li><li>● Follow guidelines for online safety and etiquette.</li><li>● Take care of school devices and materials, including Chromebook and charger. All students are expected to pay \$15 Chromebook fee.</li><li>● Look for assignments that your teacher has graded and returned to you.</li><li>● Adhere to school dress code for online class meetings.</li><li>● Check email at least twice daily. (Check from 8am-11am and from 11am-2pm.)</li><li>● Complete attendance check-in (Google Form) on remote days for all teachers</li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>● Share instructional plans a week in advance with students and parents, including all assignments due dates and times.</li><li>● Teachers will communicate with parents weekly if a student's grade falls to 65 or below.</li><li>● Provide clear expectations and guidelines for all learning activities and assessments including an expected time for completion.</li><li>● Respond to student/parent email in a timely manner. (Weekdays - 24 hours)</li><li>● Provide engaging and rigorous daily lessons via face-to-face or teacher recorded content aligned to the NCSCS.</li><li>● Record attendance daily.</li><li>● Adhere to <a href="#">School Board Policy 3400</a> for grading/accountability.</li><li>● Communicate effectively with students that have limited internet access. (Alternate assignments may be necessary.)</li><li>● Provide two instructional videos for each class per week.</li><li>● Teachers will strive to send out class emails at the same day/time so students will know when to expect communications.</li><li>● Create a classroom community in which students are included as part of a learning group</li><li>● Attend PLC meetings on Wednesdays.</li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>● Communicate with teachers on a regular basis.</li><li>● Monitor student progress on Canvas and PowerSchool, and monitor your child's learning activities at home.</li><li>● Complete your child's first assignment by providing accurate contact information by email to each teacher.</li><li>● Help your child develop a weekly schedule and discuss what should be accomplished each week.</li><li>● Provide a quiet work environment for your child with minimal distractions.</li><li>● Talk to your child about their work and goals.</li><li>● Read all school communication and contact the teacher if you have questions or concerns.</li><li>● Partner with teachers to maximize student success in remote and face-to-face learning.</li><li>● Read and understand the <a href="#">ACHS Hybrid Plan B Learning Guidelines</a> during the first week of school.</li><li>● Monitor your child's attendance and communicate with teachers if health concerns arise.</li></ul>
